## **Country Profile**

## Highlights of the Supply Chain Master Plan



- A single integrated Supply Chain Management Unit (SCMU) responsible for all commodities across vertical programs and essential medicines focused on:
  - Information systems
  - Procurement and supply planning
  - Monitoring and evaluating at the central level
- A move from the CMS delivering to the regional level to an approach delivering directly to facilities
- Regional level pharmacists responsible for monitoring of the supply chain






## Clear roles and responsibilities were set out to allow for resource planning




#### Organizations, Roles & Alignment





### An integrated Supply Chain Management Unit was formed





#### Set up

- 4 full pharmacists were recruited for the main roles
- Most recruits had experience in the Liberian supply chain system



# The MOHSW has chosen pharmacists as its cadre of supply chain operatives



- Training as a pharmacist in Liberia takes 8 years
- > 52 registered pharmacists in Liberia with approximately 10 graduating annually
- 29 are employed by the MOHSW and 2 by the CMS
- 4 at the SCMU and 16 taking regional supply chain roles County Pharmacists



#### Pre-Service Training



- Pharmacists are currently managing the supply chain
- Few pre-service institutions including one degree granting institution are conducting pharmacist trainings
- Existing Pre-service training does not include supply chain training
- Necessary for pre-service curriculum to include aspects of supply chain
- This will address to some extent the human resource challenges

Additional cadre or professional training is required to fill in the gaps on supply chain training.



#### In-Service Training



- Logistics Management Information System (LMIS) Training
  - LMIS is being rolled out across the country in phases
  - Classroom training and 'On the job' training curriculum has been developed
  - Training of regional staff has started and is planned through 2012.
- External Scholarships
  - John Harris, SCMU Manager, is completing Masters in pharmaceutical management ship
    - Scholarship provided by USAID
  - A regular program of external scholarships needs to be established to train more people
- Training of regional supply chain staff
  - Regional staff trained on supply chain issues on an ongoing basis
  - Training limited by lack of easy availability of training organizations & training materials

Additional support needed for establishing a regular in service training program to benefit central and regional staff.



#### Next Steps and Ongoing Activities



- Continuous training follow by monitoring and supportive supervision
- Provision of the relevant forms/tool to enhance work and to track all transactions of health commodities
- Step-by-step implementation of supply chain master plan
- Search for support/scholarship for human resource development
- Putting in place measures to mitigate risk management in supply chain
